News From Supervisor Napper Plans Underway for 2025

Another year over, a new one is about to begin. Time seems to pass very quickly. Most people I talk to who are around my age can't believe how we got so old so fast. The fact 2024 was our Bicentennial year makes reflection especially relevant this year. I often think how much things have changed in my 72 years. When I was in school, there were many dairy farms in town. Even then, the number of stonewalls in the woods was impressive. In 1824, our predecessors were still clearing land. It reminds me that the one constant is change.

Updating our Buildings and Grounds

We've had a busy year. Our **Town Hall** is nearly 50 years old, and we continue to update it. The parking lot has been repaved and we continue to remodel the inside of the building. We still have more to do. The **Courthouse** is the second town building to get heat pumps. Grant funding covered most of our costs. Our experience, so far, indicates heat pumps are both practical and cost-efficient.

The **Saranac American Legion** in Redford continues to step up to help our town. We worked with them to add swings at the **Rita Wilson Playground** in Redford. By the time you read this, we hope the clock they purchased for **Town Green** will be installed. The recent hurricane impacted the clock's manufacturer and has delayed the project.

This year, we continued to do **recovery work** from July 2023 floods. The process will continue next year. We have received most of the funding related to the damage, but have not yet had enough time to complete the effort.

Other issues we would like to address revolve around **safety**. The school, Town Green, and Bowen Road area see a lot of traffic, including foot traffic. A study is being done **to find ways to make the area safer**. Speed limits in this area have long been considered. Residents expressed interest in **lower speed limits** on some of our other roads, as well, as safer intersections. The process to change speed limits is long and involves other layers of government. We have started the process and **wish to have input from our residents**.

Celebrating with Our Community

For 2025, we do plan, once again, to have a **Field Day and Parade**. That will occur on **Saturday**, **September 6**, after Labor Day. The parade was a real success in 2024, but the Field Day was impacted by weather. The **fireworks** at dark were spectacular, though. We will also have **Kid's Day**, presumably at Bowen Road Park, in July.

Looking ahead, we can all hope for a peaceful, prosperous, and healthy time in 2025. As always, your elected representatives need to hear of your concerns. Please reach out with your ideas to help us to do a better job.

COMMUNITY:

Auxiliary members then partnered with the **Assumption of Mary Church** October 27th, with their "**Trunk or Treat**" event, held in the school and parking lot. These events grow every year and are a big hit with local families.

The Legion Auxiliary also held their annual **Christmas breakfast with Santa** December 15th. Gifts were handed out to local children by Santa. It was another fun time for the kids and the community.

This Fall, the Legion continued to sponsor the **Lady Mariners** softball program by hosting and donating to several spaghetti fundraiser dinners.

During Summer and Fall 2024, Legion patrons have been enjoying the music of the **Terry Mountain Boys**. This local band has provided a popular respite for our members who enjoy food, music, dancing, and fellowship. STUDENTS:

October 2024, the Legion **donated \$2,000 for Saranac students** to purchase needed supplies for the year. A warm thank you letter of gratitude was received from the students and staff.

This year, the Legion awarded seven \$1,000 scholarships for local students attending college during the 2024-2025 school year. Sons of the American Legion (SAL), and Legion Auxiliary also awarded scholarships to worthy students. Applications for scholarship opportunities at the Post and the county level are available at Saranac Central School or by contacting the Legion.

Post 1618 continues to support local students who participate in academic and leadership competitions like the **American Legion Oratorical Contest**, and the **Boys' State Program**. Applications can be found at the High School guidance office, or you can contact the Legion.

The Legion has been a longtime sponsor of the local **Scouting America** program. This year's recharter included fourteen scouts and leaders. The troop is always looking for interested young people to join their ranks and is expected to grow this year.

November 2024, several Legion members attended a Veteran's Day event at Saranac Elementary School. Flags were displayed in front of the school, representing students who have a veteran as a parent. They also raised \$1,000 to donate to the North Country Honor Flight.

November 2024, the Legion donated to the Saranac and Peru joint Varsity hockey team to assist with the purchase of equipment and ice time.

VETERANS:

October 2024, Post 1618 donated to the **Homeward Bound of the Adirondacks** to assist a **Vietnam veteran** who needed **a lift and truck cap** for his wheelchair. Homeward Bound of the Adirondacks is a nonprofit entity, staffed by veterans, seeking to serve local veterans and positively impact their lives.

The final **North Country Honor Flight** for this year was held on October 5th. 244 motorcycles from The Legion Riders and other rider groups escorted veterans from their homes to the send-off ceremony on the Oval in Plattsburgh. Post Commander **Rick Fournia**, Former Commander **Jim Farrell**, Historian and past Adjutant **Bob Fish**, Executive Committee member **Todd Perry**, and member **Rick Roberts** were honored on this flight. Legionnaires and Legion Riders **donated \$12,000** to cover the cost of one flight, including all the veterans on the flight and their guardians. A bus load of **Saranac High School students** attended to help honor our heroes. After the event, **breakfast** was held at the Legion for the students and attendees. Additional donations were collected for next year's events, scheduled to begin in May 2025.

We have also been **hosting lunches at the Legion** on Tuesdays during the summer and fall of 2024. **More than \$10,000** has been raised this year for the North Country Honor Flight.

This years' **Hometown Heroes Banners** were removed after Veteran's Day for cleaning and storage. **Town of Saranac employees** were a key team player in this effort, with **more than 85 banners**. They will be re-installed in the spring, on or about Memorial Day. Several executives helped lay wreaths on more than 480 gravesites on December 13, 2024 in four cemeteries. A luncheon after the days' activities rounded off this solemn event. December 14, 2024, wreaths were placed for each branch of military service during the Honor Guard ceremony, held at Legion headquarters. Wreath laying was followed by a **fellowship luncheon** that was open to the public.

Le Vent du Nord is a leading force in Quebec's progressive **francophone folk movement**. The group's vast repertoire draws from both traditional sources and original compositions, while enhancing its hard-driving soulful music (rooted in the Celtic diaspora) with a broad range of global influences. **Featuring button accordion, guitar, fiddle, vocals, and foot percussion**, the band's sound is defined by the hurdy-gurdy, which adds an earthy, rough-hewn flavor to even the most buoyant dance tunes.

Named Lughnasadh for an ancient Celtic harvest festival in honor of the Irish god Lugh, Lúnasa was formed in 1997 from members of some of the greatest Irish groups of the previous decade. Local Law - It shall be unlawful for any owner of any dog to permit or allow such dog to engage in habitual howling, barking, crying or whining or to conduct itself in such a manner as to unreasonably and habitually annoy or disturb any person other than the owner of the dog, regardless of whether or not the dog is on the owner's premises.

Missing Dog - If your dog is missing or you pick up a stray, aside from leaving a voicemail message, posting a photo on Facebook helps get owners and pets reunited.

HI EVERYONE, STEVE FROM HIGHWAY:

This summer we paved a few of the Town's roads; not as much as we wanted. We paved **Nashville Road** and **Hugh Heron Rd**. In Redford we paved **Clinton, Champlain, Bridge, Elm, Maple, and Pine Streets.** We also did part of **Strackville Rd**. We utilized **shared service** with the **Town of Dannemora** and the **Town of Franklin**. Their guys came down and helped in paving our roads, and our guys did go up and pave some roads for them. We worked on **Collins Rd**., cutting shoulders and laying down item #4 to repair the road. We worked on **Moore Rd**., grading it and laying down item #4. We cut shoulders on some of the roads; not as many as we would have liked. We did quite a bit of ditching and a few culverts that needed to be changed.

The **sand shed is full** for the start of the snow and ice season. We are working on putting item # 4 down on our shoulders. In the Town, we are trying to get as much done as possible. It takes time.

We have **two** new **Western Star** trucks being built. The cab and chassis should be done this month. Then, they go to **Viking** to get set up with plows & sanders. Although it is unusual for us to order two trucks at once, we did this, not only due to the age of our fleet, but we expect the State to shortly mandate electric plow trucks, which would be entirely inadequate for our needs

At this time, we are plowing and sanding our roads, keeping the roads as clear as we can from snow and ice.
