# SUPERVISOR NAPPER'S REPORT ON THE TOWN

I think everyone has been anxious for our old-fashioned winter to be over. The President's weekend storm has been the biggest in many years. Easter is later this year, so I'm hoping it will be warmer for the **Easter Egg Hunt**. We plan to have it at the **Bowen Rd Park** on **April** 12<sup>th</sup>. The rain date would be April 13<sup>th</sup>.

Spring is a time for figuring out all the things you would like to see happen. The delayed installation of the **Town Green Clock** should happen before Memorial Day. The **Saranac American Legion** is **funding** the project, and the **Town** has helped with installing the **foundation and the power**.

We have been working with Clinton County to make the School/Town Green/Bowen Rd area more friendly and safer for pedestrians. We also are pursuing some type of speed reduction near the school on Route 3. Talks with New York State indicate they are mostly focusing on pedestrian and bicycle traffic near schools and don't put a high priority on making it safer for the buses. We have also had much interest on reducing speed limits on some our town roads. That process is even more complex, but we are trying to respond to those people who have raised serious safety concerns.

Other projects include more work on the **Standish Playground**, the **reuse of the old Firehouse**, and **improving the walkability of the Bowen Rd**.

September 6<sup>th</sup> is the date for our Parade and Field Day, which will include fireworks and, hopefully, less rain than last year. We have been working on refreshing the interior of the Town Hall for over two years now. The downstairs, kitchen, main hall and several of the offices will soon be finished. The Courthouse building now has a heat pump, which was mostly paid for by a grant.

Although it seems like the **severe storms of July 2023** was quite some time ago, we still have a considerable amount of work to do to alleviate the damage. The **heavily traveled roads were worked on first**. Along with **finishing touches** such as shoulders on those roads, there are four fairly major projects on those less traveled areas. **Maggy Road** and **Wolf Pond Road**, along with two roads associated with the **Redford Water works**, need considerable attention.

We currently have two new plow trucks at the equipment dealer awaiting the plowing equipment. We bought two trucks because shortly new plow trucks will be mandated by New York State to be fully electric. Such trucks are unsuited for our conditions and are drastically more expensive. Along with regular highway maintenance, we hope to pave over five miles of road this year.

In closing, we are hoping for a good year for our town and are always seeking your insights, comments, and ideas.



<u>Local Law</u> - It shall be unlawful for any owner of any dog to permit or allow such dog to engage in habitual howling, barking, crying or whining or to conduct itself in such a manner as to unreasonably and habitually annoy or disturb any person other than the owner of the dog, regardless of whether or not the dog is on the owner's premises.

Missing Dog - If your dog is missing or you pick up a stray, aside from leaving a voicemail message, posting a photo on Facebook helps get owners and pets reunited.
